What does the Family Counselling – Drug & Alcohol program do?

We offer counselling support to families where one of the family experiences issues with alcohol or other drug use.

We aim to offer the most effective and flexible service possible.

Family Counselling Alcohol & Other Drugs

What do we have to offer?

The Family Counselling – Drug & Alcohol program offers a free, confidential counselling service which aims to support families where relationships in the family have been affected by alcohol or other drug use.

How do we do this?

We offer individual, couple and / or family counselling. We work with each family to find the most effective way to address their unique situation. This service may happen in the office, in the home or other outreach locations.

Who can use the Family Counselling – Drug & Alcohol program?

Any family or family member where there is, or has been, strains on the family due to the effect of alcohol or other drugs.

Any family member can request the service for themselves, or for the whole or part of the family.

You need to live in the area east of the Hume highway, between Mansfield in the south and Corryong in the north – west of the highway we cover from Wangaratta across to Rutherglen.

How do families access these Services?

By directly contacting our Family Services manager or the Family Counsellor in the Alcohol and Other Drugs program.

Is there a waiting list?

“There might be!” But please don’t let that put you off.

How long are the services provided?

This will depend on the plans and needs of the family. Some just need a short time; others may take a bit longer.

Is there a cost involved?

No, the services are provided free of charge. The Victorian Government’s Department of Human Services provides the funding.
